She was first launched in 1904 and had a long and exciting career on the seas working the ports of Europe, Mexico, Australia, Africa and America. She has hauled coal, copper ore, nitrate, lumber and grain. The Moshulu is a 107 year old Clipper Sailing Ship which has been turned into a stationary; AAA approved Four Diamond restaurant at Penn's Landing in Philadelphia. The Moshulu is 397 feet long with her masts towering 220 feet above her Charthouse Deck with 3-course sit-down menus, complimentary on-sight motor-coach parking and special history presentation for groups, makes her one of the most unique venues in the world.
